2021DERFUL

Give appreciation to school staff in May

School has been anything but normal over the past year. Show some love to educators who've shown great care, flexibility and ingenuity.

When? Anytime throughout May.

What? Ask members to help deliver treats, thank-you cards and smiles during a drive-thru appreciation event for educators in your community.

How?

Request it!

- Identify school(s) you wish to appreciate and determine a date and location for your event.
- 2. Complete the request form at least seven days before the event.
 - **Name of event:** Drive-thru school staff appreciation.
 - **Recipient category:** Special campaign.
 - **Recipient name:** Enter the name of the school(s) or school district.
 - **Location:** Choose an outdoor location that will allow school staff to drive through and pick up items.
 - Information for Operations team: Share details about how your event meets the limited-contact guidelines for service projects.
 - **Supplies area:** This is where you can order a branded thank-you banner (see design on Page 5).

- 3. Use the fillable postcard (found on the Training Materials site) or laser printer postcards (available to order on the Supplies order form). Request RSVPs from members. Suggested message:

 Due to COVID-19, space is limited.

 Contact me at [phone] or [email] to volunteer to help before or during the event.
- 4. Mail the postcards to members.

Host it!

- Assign tasks to members who RSVP. (Follow limited-contact guidelines, such as assigning shifts to member households participating in person.)
 Possible tasks include buying items for goody bags, assembling bags, making thank-you cards, setting up, distributing bags, cheering and cleaning up.
- Use the thank-you banner and other supplies to decorate the event location.
- Hold the event. Your volunteer cheer squads should remain in their cars while cheering on school staff as they drive through and pick up their goody bags.
- Share photos on social media (and encourage school staff and volunteers to do so, too). You can also take advantage of the media release and social media posts found in the 2021derful toolkit.

Report it!

- Use your RSVPs to track attendance.
 Add this information to the electronic attendance-tracking tool. Or upload a copy of your RSVP tracking sheet in the sign-in sheet area.
- Include the cost of the banner and any other expenses incurred in the report's cost area. Attach receipts or a note in the receipt area. Youth clubs should include the banner cost in the total cost of the event.

Win it!

 Submit your report no later than 30 days after your event to be entered into a drawing for a \$500 travel gift card! (Three winners will be drawn in August.)

May is just around the corner. Need a little inspiration for your 2021derful school staff appreciation service project? We caught up with leaders **Yvonne Wade** and **Willie Moffett** while they were in the early planning stages last month.

Yvonne's plan

Summit chapter 18159 Farmington, Missouri

Describe your project.

Yvonne: We'll make and pass out appreciation bags to area teachers. Plans are still in progress, but some filler ideas I've had for the bags include snacks, travel-sized hand sanitizer, something small from Oriental Trading, and Modern Woodmen thank-you stickers and pens [available through Modern Woodmen representatives, not through imakeanimpact.org].

Where will you hold your event?

Yvonne: I got permission to hold the event outside the local high school in the teachers' parking lot. This is better for social distancing, and it allows us to catch all the teachers as they leave.

I contacted someone in the principal's office, so I can get a head count closer to the event. We want it to be a surprise for the teachers, but also want to make sure we have enough bags for everyone.

How will members participate?

Yvonne: Due to COVID and limited space with social distancing, I'm asking members to contact me, so I can schedule volunteers. Donations will be dropped off at the regional Modern Woodmen office. Some members will be making the appreciation bags and others passing them out.

Why did you decide to plan this project?

Yvonne: There are so many professions that need to be honored as essential workers. Teachers are definitely at the head of the list. They've been adapting to make sure our children don't fall behind during the pandemic, and so they get the interaction they need to thrive. This is a great way to say thank you!



MAKE 2021DERFUL

Willie's plan

Club 12293-1 Antioch, California

Describe your project.

Willie: Teachers will display their school IDs in their car windows. They'll drive through – seeing our signs of appreciation, balloons, decorations, etc. – pick up a goody bag and drive out. For the bags, we're thinking Starbucks and/or Subway gift cards, along with thank-you cards and mini hand sanitizer.

I reached out to the school to find out how many staff members they have and who could be my point of contact to help disseminate information about the event.

Where will you hold your event?

Willie: At the local youth center parking lot. If it were held at the school, a staff member would have to work to ensure gates were opened/closed, etc. I wanted to make sure the staff were truly being appreciated.

How will members participate?

Willie: Members will assist with making thank-you cards, appreciation posters and decorations/balloons. They will also help collect items to fill goody bags and assemble them so they're ready for the event.

What's your best tip for other leaders?

Willie: I think the most important part is to ask for ideas and plan in advance. Let everyone know what the plan is, tell them what you need help with, and ask them how they would like to assist. When people know the plan and how they can help, normally they're more than willing to do what's needed ... and then some.

TRACKING ATTENDANCE

in unusual times

Tracking attendance for no-contact and limited-contact events can be tricky. Members are performing service projects from their own homes, dropping off items at designated locations, and grabbing food through restaurant drive-thrus. How do you make sure you're capturing attendance accurately?

Keep track of calls and emails. When members call to volunteer for an event or share their plans for getting involved, record their names.

Ask members to send a text or email when their family completes a service-at-home project. They could include a photo for you to share in the chapter/club closed Facebook group.

Require members to bring the postcard invitation

as their admission ticket when ordering for restaurant takeout or drive-thru events. Ask the restaurant to collect the invitations. It not only identifies who should receive the discount, but it also helps track attendance. Other ideas used by leaders:

- Use the admission tickets (F-1358 and F-1359) available in the Supplies area of imakeanimpact.org (rather than the postcard invitation) as the ticket to the event.
- Ask for RSVPs and send coupons or gift cards for members to use. (We recommend limiting the number of coupons/gift cards per member.)
- Use the postcard to share a password that members give when ordering. Ask the restaurant to keep track of those who use it.

Ask members to introduce themselves during virtual events and share how long they've been Modern Woodmen members. Write down the names of each member on the call.

Take advantage of the electronic attendance tool

available in imakeanimpact.org rather than using a sign-in sheet to record member names. The information is automatically added to the activity report. No need to upload sign-in sheets.

Under construction: Fraternal Connect!

A new and improved way to check in attendees at fraternal events is coming soon. Fraternal Connect will be the first mobile app created just for Modern Woodmen fraternal leaders. The free application for smartphones and tablets helps you track attendance in a more convenient, reliable way.

This new tool:

- Is easy to use.
- Allows you to check in entire member households at one time.
- Pre-populates guests who previously attended an event.
- Helps you analyze who's attending events.
- Helps you report attendance accurately.
- Is easily accessible in a web browser if you prefer that option.

Once released, Fraternal Connect will replace the current electronic attendance tool. Make using the tool a habit and use it for all your fraternal events!

How do you keep your receipts organized?

There are many right ways. Here are just a few suggestions leaders shared

- Put the receipts and a note listing event details in an envelope labeled with the chapter/club number.
- Take a picture of the receipt on your phone, and email it to yourself. List the activity, date and chapter/club number in the email.
- Send in your report as quickly as possible to avoid losing receipts. Discard the receipt once you upload it to the system.
- Put a dedicated wallet in your purse/bag specifically for chapter/club receipts.
- · Use a coupon holder to organize receipts.
- Keep receipts in a clearly marked bank bag, along with the chapter checkbook, ATM card and any cash you may need for an event.
- Keep your chapter information in a 3-ring binder, and store the receipts in the inside pocket or in zippered pouches.
- Use an app, like Expensify.

Upcoming holidays

You could plan any of these activities virtually or in person, depending on the guidelines in force at that time



- National Running Day June 2: Encourage members to participate in a virtual walk or run. Share your experiences in your closed Facebook group.
- National Doughnut Day June 4: Have a drive-thru social activity at your local doughnut shop.
- National Trails Day June 5: Invite members to sign up to help clean local hiking trails. Assign different time slots per family to encourage social distancing.
- National Go Fishing Day June 18: Invite members to learn fishing basics at a virtual educational event.
- National Selfie Day June 21: Did someone say selfie? Have some fun with a selfie contest. Members post their selfies on your closed Facebook group and vote on their favorites. Winner(s) get a special prize.



- National Postal Worker Day July 1: Encourage members to create thank-you baskets for postal workers and delivery drivers. Leave the baskets on porches or by mailboxes with signs inviting workers/drivers to take a snack or beverage as a thank you.
- All-American Pet Photo Day July
 11: Have some fun with a pet photo contest. Members could post photos of their pets on your closed Facebook group and vote on their favorites. Give a special prize to the winner(s).
- Get to Know Your Customers Day

 July 15: Get to know your members with a virtual show and tell or a member survey to better understand their interests. (You could use the new member interest survey. See Page 10.) Enter participants into a drawing for a prize.
- National Ice Cream Day July 18: Host a virtual ice cream (un)social for members.
- National Drive-Thru Day July 24: Invite members to a drive-thru social activity.



- National Disc Golf Day Aug. 7: Invite members to learn about disc golf at a virtual educational event.
- National Book Lovers Day Aug.
 9: Host a book swap where members share their favorite literature. Ask participating members to wrap a book, write a one-sentence summary on the cover, and drop it off at a specified location. Members can then choose a recommended book based on the summary (and not the cover).
- National Nonprofit Day Aug. 17:
 Create a wish list for a local nonprofit and ask members to donate items from the list.
- National Thrift Shop Day Aug. 17: Encourage members to donate gently used items for the local Salvation Army or a similar organization.

ORDER these supplies

These new items can help make your upcoming events fun, organized and unique to Modern Woodmen. Go to the Order Supplies section of imakeanimpact. org to order.

- Welcome and sign-in tabletop banners: Welcome your attendees with branded, self-standing tabletop signs (size: 12 by 17 inches, welcome sign design shown above). Each sign features an area where you can customize your chapter/club number and event name using a dry-erase marker. (While we're still under COVID guidelines, you could use these as background props at your virtual event or on a table at pickup/drop-off events.)
- Event nametags: Help easily identify your chapter's or club's leader and board members as well as first-time attendees, special speakers and event honorees.
- Branded giveaway items: Order these new items for event attendees or add to goody bags for service project recipients – water bottle with sipper, notebook with pen or coloring book with crayons.
